Assembly, but will not be expected to adopt resolutions on a regular basis.

## 4. Bureaux of the Standing Committees

4.1 Description of the modification:

Chapter "Officers" of the Committee Rules will be renamed "Bureau". Each
Bureau will have one President and one Vice-President, to be elected in one go. Geopolitical groups are expected to coordinate with each otherso as to ensure, to the extent possible, an equitable distribution of leadership functions within the Bureaux. The current system of titular and substitute members of the Bureaux will be replaced by a unified system, with all members being titular and each geopolitical group represented by at least two members.
Larger geopolitical groups may have additional seats on the Bureaux.

## Rules of the Standing Committees

OFFICERSBUREAU RULE 7

1. Each Standing Committee shall elect a Bureau composed of a minimum of two representatives of each of the existing geopolitical groups. Similar to the system established for the composition of the Executive Committee (cf. Statutes, Art. 23.4), medium-sized geopolitical groups will be entitled to one additional seat on the Bureau, whereas larger groups will be entitled to two additional seats. The Standing Committees shall elect a President and a Vice-Presidents, one of whom shall be elected as First Vice-President. from among the members of their Bureau. They shall represent the oxisting goopolitical Groups and the number of Bureau mombers shall be equivalent to the number of geopolitical Groups. Each member shall have a substitute. An effort shall be made to ensure gender balance.

The representation of the Geopolitical Groups will be by a minimum of two of their representatives in order to observe the principle of equality among the groups, with no indication to the medium-sized or large-sized Geopolitical Group, since this will breach the rules of equality among he Members, and it will also breach the voting system. Therefore, we suggest to delete what is related to the medium-sized or large-sized Geopolitical Groups. To keep this sentence and not to delete it.
