# CONVOCATION OF THE 117<sup>th</sup> ASSEMBLY OF THE INTER-PARLIAMENTARY UNION

Madam President, Mr. President,

It is our pleasure to inform you that, in accordance with the decision taken by the Governing Council at its 180<sup>th</sup> session (May 2007), the 117<sup>th</sup> Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and related meetings will be held in Geneva, Switzerland, from Monday, 8 to Wednesday, 10 October 2007.

#### 1. AGENDA

The agenda of the Assembly is as follows:

- 1. Election of the President and Vice-Presidents of the Assembly
- 2. Emergency item
- 3. Panel discussions on the subject items chosen for debate during the 118<sup>th</sup> Assembly in April 2008:
  - (a) The role of parliaments in striking a balance between national security, human security and individual freedoms, and in averting the threat to democracy (First Standing Committee)
  - (b) Parliamentary oversight of State policies on foreign aid (Second Standing Committee)
  - (c) Migrant workers, people trafficking, xenophobia and human rights (Third Standing Committee)
- 4. Report of the IPU Committee on United Nations Affairs
- 5. Amendments to the Statutes and Rules of the Inter-Parliamentary Union

#### 2. TIMETABLE \*

The timetable of the Assembly is set out in <u>Annex I</u>. The debate on any possible emergency item will be held in plenary by the Assembly. The closing sitting of the 117<sup>th</sup> Assembly will take place on Wednesday, 10 October, from **4 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.** During this sitting, the report on the eventual emergency item included in the Assembly agenda will be presented and the draft resolution submitted for adoption. Delegations are kindly requested to bear this in mind when making their travel arrangements.

#### 3. EMERGENCY ITEM

The relevant provisions of the Statutes and Rules are as follows:

Statutes - Article 14.2

"2. The Assembly may include one emergency item in its agenda (cf. Assembly Rule 11)."

Assembly Rule 11

- "1. Any Member of the Union may request the inclusion of an emergency item in the Assembly agenda. Such a request may be accompanied by a brief explanatory memorandum and a draft resolution. The Secretariat shall communicate the request and any such documents immediately to all Members.
- 2. Consideration and acceptance by the Assembly of a request for the inclusion of an emergency item in its agenda shall be subject to the following provisions:
- (a) A request for the inclusion of an emergency item must relate to a major event of international concern on which it appears necessary for the IPU to express its opinion. Such a request must receive a two-thirds majority of the votes cast in order to be accepted.
- (b) The Assembly may place only one emergency item on its agenda. Should several requests obtain the requisite majority, the one having received the largest number of positive votes shall be accepted."

If the Assembly decides to include an emergency item in its agenda, this will be debated by the Assembly on Monday, 8 October 2007. Provision has also been made on the following day for an eventual meeting of a drafting committee to prepare a draft resolution.

#### 4. PLACE OF MEETINGS

The 117<sup>th</sup> Assembly, the meetings of the Governing Council and all other related meetings will take place in the *Centre international de Conférences de Genève* (CICG).

#### 5. PARTICIPATION

Article 10 of the Statutes of the IPU stipulates that:

"1. The Assembly shall be composed of parliamentarians designated as delegates by the Members of the Union. Members shall include male and female parliamentarians in their delegation and shall strive to ensure equal representation of men and women.

- 2. The number of members of Parliament appointed as delegates to the first annual session of the Assembly by a Member of the Union shall in no case exceed eight in respect of Parliaments of countries with a population of less than one hundred million inhabitants, or ten in respect of Parliaments of countries with a population of one hundred million inhabitants or more. The number of delegates to the <a href="mailto:second/annual session">second/annual session</a> shall not exceed five, or seven for Parliaments of countries with a population of one hundred million inhabitants or more.
- 3. Any delegation composed exclusively of parliamentarians of the same sex shall automatically be reduced by one person."

As regards Article 10.2 of the Statutes, please note that the number of additional MPs accompanying delegations must not exceed two. They will be listed as advisers.

Pursuant to Article 5.2 of the Statutes, IPU Members whose arrears equal or exceed the amount of the contributions due from them for the preceding two full years may not be represented by more than two delegates at meetings of the Union.

Associate Members may participate in the Assembly and its Standing Committees with the same rights as Members, with the exception of the right to vote and to present candidates for elective office.

International organizations of an intergovernmental or inter-parliamentary nature and other bodies included in a list established by the Governing Council (180<sup>th</sup> session, May 2007) have been invited to be represented at the Assembly as observers.

#### 6. STEERING COMMITTEE

Assembly Rule 9 states that the Steering Committee of the Assembly shall be composed of the President of the Assembly, the President of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and the Vice-President of the Executive Committee. The Presidents of the Standing Committees may take part in its work in an advisory capacity.

The Steering Committee, assisted by the IPU Secretary General, is mandated to take all appropriate measures to ensure the effective organization and normal functioning of the Assembly proceedings.

#### 7. PANEL DISCUSSIONS

As part of the overall decision on the consolidation of the reform of the IPU, the 180<sup>th</sup> session of the Governing Council, held in Nusa Dua, Bali, Indonesia, in May 2007, decided that, on a trial basis, the three Standing Committees would not meet during the second Assembly of the year.

Instead, a panel discussion will be held on each of the three subject items placed on the agenda of the 118<sup>th</sup> Assembly to be held in South Africa. The purpose of this exercise is, on the one hand, to raise the awareness of IPU Members of the subjects at hand and, on the other, to facilitate the task of the co-Rapporteurs by providing them with an intermediary checkpoint halfway through the drafting process, so that they could fine-tune their concepts in the light of comments by experts and the IPU membership.

Each panel discussion will last approximately two hours. In addition to the co-Rapporteurs designated for the 118<sup>th</sup> Assembly, each panel will include a number of renowned experts, to be identified by the IPU Secretariat in consultation with relevant international organizations. The format of the panels will be largely informal, with focus on debate and interaction as opposed to the reading out of pre-prepared speeches.

During the panels, IPU Members will have the opportunity to provide comments and suggestions on the preliminary draft reports, to be prepared by the co-Rapporteurs for distribution to delegates ahead of the 117<sup>th</sup> Assembly. There will be no formal outcome of the panels apart from a record of their proceedings.

#### 8. TABLE SHOWING THE ALLOCATION OF VOTES

A provisional table showing the votes allocated to delegations at the 117<sup>th</sup> Assembly is contained in Annex II.

Members are kindly requested to check the figures concerning them and, if necessary, inform in writing the IPU Secretariat in Geneva of any modifications required, preferably in advance. The final table for the allocation of votes at the Assembly will be distributed at the opening of the session.

#### 9. LANGUAGES

The Secretariat of the Inter-Parliamentary Union will provide simultaneous interpretation into and from the two official languages of the Union: English and French, as well as Arabic and Spanish, at the meetings of all statutory bodies.

Four other interpretation channels have been reserved for Chinese, Italian, Japanese and Russian at sittings of the Assembly, the Governing Council, and for the Panel discussions.

Delegates may, exceptionally, use another language provided that they arrange for their speech to be interpreted into one or other of the IPU's official languages, and that copies of the speech be given to the Chief Interpreter (Ms. F. Steinig-Huang) well in advance and no later than two hours before it is to be delivered.

#### 10. MEETINGS OF OTHER BODIES

Other bodies will hold meetings during the Assembly; their members will be convened by means of a special letter. They include:

- ▶ The Governing Council (8, 9 and 10 October, public sittings);
- The Executive Committee (5, 6 and 10 October, in camera);
- The Coordinating Committee of Women Parliamentarians (7 October, in camera);
- The Gender Partnership Group (5 and 6 October, in camera);
- The Committee on the Human Rights of Parliamentarians (6, 7, 8 and 9 October, in camera);
- The Committee on Middle East Questions (7 and 8 October, in camera);
- The Committee on United Nations Affairs (8, 9, and 10 October, public sittings);
- Panel discussions (8 October, public sittings).

The Association of Secretaries General of Parliaments (ASGP) will also meet at the CICG during the Assembly. It will be convened by its President.

#### 11. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THE SESSION

Further information concerning the session will be provided in the Assembly Guidebook and in the "Additional information" document, which will be distributed to delegations on upon registration.

#### Journal

Every day during the Assembly, participants will find in all meeting rooms and at the Registration and Information desk the "Journal", which provides the latest updates on the programme of meetings and other important information designed to facilitate their participation in the proceedings of the session.

#### 12. RESULTS OF THE ASSEMBLY

All delegations will receive two printed copies of the *Results* of the 117<sup>th</sup> Assembly and a diskette containing the Results can be sent on request. In addition, the document will be accessible on the IPU website (www.ipu.org) two weeks following the Assembly, when a complete electronic version of the *Results* can be downloaded from the IPU site in PDF Format.

#### Registration and Information service

This service, available on the premises of the CICG, will be open as follows:

- 12 noon to 6 p.m. on Saturday, 6 October;
- 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. from Sunday, 7 October to Tuesday, 9 October; and
- 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Wednesday, 10 October.

Delegates are also informed that this service will only hand over identity badges and documentation to representatives from their Permanent Missions in Geneva if a signed letter of authorization has been received from the Member Parliament to this effect.

#### **IMPORTANT**

#### **Hotel reservations**

Delegations from countries having a Permanent Mission in Geneva are kindly requested to make their hotel reservations through their respective Mission. The Permanent Missions in Geneva will all be duly informed of the holding of the 117<sup>th</sup> Assembly. Most Missions are accustomed to receiving national delegations to United Nations meetings and to handling hotel reservations for them, and many have signed agreements and obtained preferential rates with hotels close to the Palais des Nations area and the CICG.

Delegations from countries that do not have a diplomatic representation in Geneva may reserve their rooms either via their preferred tourist operator or through the Geneva Tourist Office. Should delegations wish to use the services offered by the Geneva Tourist Office, they are kindly requested to contact the IPU Secretariat, which will subsequently send them a hotel reservation form. However, attention is drawn to the fact that, according the practice of all hotels in Geneva, only

reservation forms returned with details of a credit card as a guarantee will be confirmed. The hotel reservation form should be returned directly to the Geneva Tourist Office by no later than **1 September 2007**, with copy to the IPU Secretariat.

#### Visas

Strict regulations are in force regarding entry into Switzerland and entry is refused to persons not holding the required visa. Delegates requiring an entry visa must obtain one from the Swiss consulate or diplomatic mission responsible for the necessary arrangements in their country of residence.

Only in very exceptional cases, if a delegate has been unable to obtain a visa from the Swiss consulate or diplomatic country in their country of residence, a visa may be obtained upon arrival at Geneva Airport, provided that the IPU Secretariat in Geneva has been advised thereof by e-mail (postbox@mail.ipu.org) or via facsimile (+4122 919 41 60) **three weeks prior** to the date of arrival. The following details should be provided in such a case: full name, date and place of birth, nationality, type of national passport and number (date of issue and expiry), date of arrival and flight number.

Moreover, Geneva Airport is located on the Swiss-French border and also has a French entry point. As such, some flights arriving from Paris or other French airports to Geneva are considered as domestic flights. Therefore, delegates may wish to check if a French visa is required for certain nationalities when passing through a French airport en route to Geneva.
