On 24 October 2012, the Governing Council will be required to elect **two members** (Eurasia Group and Latin America and Caribbean Group).

Committee on the Human Rights of Parliamentarians

On 24 October, the Governing Council will be required to elect **two substitute members** (African Group and Twelve Plus Group).

Committee on Middle East Questions

On 24 October, the Governing Council will be required to elect **three titular members and one substitute member**. According to the gender guidelines governing the composition of the Committee on Middle East Questions, the three titular members cannot all be of the same gender. The substitute member should be a woman parliamentarian.

Moreover, the members shall be elected on the basis of their interest and expertise in the subject matter and of their availability to attend all sessions.

Committee to Promote Respect for International Humanitarian Law

On 24 October, the Governing Council will be required to elect **three titular members** (Arab Group, Eurasia Group and Latin America and Caribbean Group) and **two substitute members** (Arab Group and Asia-Pacific Group).

To date, the following candidature has been received:

- Mr. P. Phalusuk (Thailand), candidature as substitute member submitted by the Thai IPU Group.

APPOINTMENT OF TWO INTERNAL AUDITORS FOR THE 2013 ACCOUNTS

On 24 October, the Governing Council will appoint **two Internal Auditors** for the 2013 fiscal year. They will report in spring 2014. Parliamentarians interested in submitting their candidature for this position should preferably have prior experience either in a parliamentary finance or audit committee.
