Coordinating Committee of Women Parliamentarians

Today, 22 March 2013, the 18th Meeting of Women Parliamentarians will be called upon to elect **one titular and one substitute regional representative** (Group of Latin America and the Caribbean (GRULAC)) and **two substitute regional representatives** (Eurasia Group).

The following candidatures have been received:

– Ms. D. Padierna (Mexico): candidature as titular regional representative submitted by GRULAC;

- Ms. Y. Ferrer Gómez (Cuba): candidature as substitute regional representative submitted by GRULAC.

Committee on the Human Rights of Parliamentarians

On 27 March 2013, the Governing Council will be required to elect **one substitute member** (Asia-Pacific Group). To date, the following candidature has been received: – Mr. A. Mahloof (Maldives): candidature submitted by the candidate himself.

Committee on Middle East Questions

On 27 March 2013, the Governing Council will be required to elect **one titular member** and **one substitute member**. According to the gender guidelines governing the composition of the Committee on Middle East Questions, no more than four of the seven members shall be of the same sex and as many of the geopolitical groups as possible shall be represented on the Committee. As such, the vacancy for substitute member will need to be filled by a woman parliamentarian.

Committee to Promote Respect for International Humanitarian Law

On 27 March 2013, the Governing Council will be required to elect **two titular members** (Arab Group and Eurasia Group) **and two substitute members** (Arab Group and Eurasia Group).

STANDING COMMITTEE BUREAUX

Apart from the vacancies indicated, all present members of the Bureaux are eligible for re-election.

First Standing Committee (Peace and International Security)

Two vacancies: One titular member and one substitute member (Eurasia Group).

Candidatures for the above vacancies may be submitted up to the time of the elections, which will take place on <u>Tuesday, 26 March 2013</u>, at the last sitting of the Committee.

Second Standing Committee (Sustainable Development, Finance and Trade)

Three vacancies: Two titular members (Arab Group and Twelve Plus Group) and one substitute member (Eurasia Group). Candidatures for the above vacancies may be submitted up to the time of the elections, which will take place on <u>Monday, 25 March 2013</u>, at the last sitting of the Committee.

Third Standing Committee (Democracy and Human Rights)


