COORDINATING COMMITTEE OF WOMEN PARLIAMENTARIANS

Today, 28 March 2015, the 21st Meeting of Women Parliamentarians will be called upon to fill the following vacancies:

- One substitute regional representative for the African Group (end of term: March 2018);

- One titular regional representative for the Arab Group (end of term: March 2016); and

- One titular regional representative for the Asia-Pacific Group (end of term: March 2018).

The following candidature has been received:

- Ms. Nze Mouenidiambou (Gabon): candidature submitted by the African Group.

FORUM OF YOUNG PARLIAMENTARIANS OF THE IPU

At its meeting on Sunday, 29 March 2015, the Forum will elect two Board members (one man and one woman) from each of the IPU geopolitical groups.

Candidatures may be submitted up to 3 p.m. today, Saturday, 28 March.

On 1 April 2015, the Governing Council will hold elections as outlined below. Candidatures (a signed letter and a one-page curriculum vitae) may be submitted to the Submission and Control of Documents Service (Room 216A, 2nd floor, NCC) up to <u>9.30 a.m. on Tuesday, 31 March 2015</u>.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Governing Council will be required to elect **three members**: one member each for the African Group, the Asia-Pacific Group and the Twelve Plus Group.

To date, the following candidature has been received: – Mr. S. Suzuki (Japan): candidature submitted by the Parliament of Japan.

COMMITTEES AND OTHER BODIES

Committee on the Human Rights of Parliamentarians

The Governing Council will be required to elect **one titular member**.

Committee to Promote Respect for International Humanitarian Law

The Governing Council will be required to elect **four members**: two members (one man and one woman) for the Asia-Pacific Group and one member (male) each for the Eurasia Group and the Twelve Plus Group.

STANDING COMMITTEE BUREAUX

At the first sitting of each Standing Committee, the following elections to the Bureaux will be held:

Standing Committee on Peace and International Security

Two vacancies: One vacancy each for the African Group to be filled by a woman, and the Asia-Pacific Group to be filled by a man or a woman.

Standing Committee on Sustainable Development, Finance and Trade

Seven vacancies: One vacancy each for the African Group to be filled by a man or a woman, and the Asia-Pacific Group to be filled by a man; two vacancies for the Eurasia Group and three vacancies for the Group of Latin American and the Caribbean (GRULAC), at least one of which must be filled by a woman.

Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights

Three vacancies: One vacancy each for the Arab Group to be filled by a woman, the Eurasia Group to be filled by a man, and GRULAC to be filled by a man or a woman.

Standing Committee on United Nations Affairs

Six vacancies: One vacancy each for the African Group, the Asia-Pacific Group and the Twelve Plus Group to be filled by a man or a woman; and three vacancies for the Eurasia Group, at least one of which must be filled by a woman. *Candidatures for the above vacancies may be submitted up to the time of the elections.*

The Chairpersons of the Standing Committee on Sustainable Development, Finance and Trade and of the Standing Committee on United Nations Affairs will be elected at the last sitting of those Committees.
