## Committee on Middle East Questions

On 5 April, the Governing Council will elect three female members to the Committee, following the adoption of the amendments to the Rules of the Committee by the Governing Council at its $199^{\text {th }}$ session.

According to the amended Rules, the Committee will be comprised of a total of 14 members, of which two are ex officio (Israel and Palestine). Rule 2.2 states that "No more than seven of the members shall be of the same sex and as many of the geopolitical groups as possible shall be represented on the Committee."

Due to the specificities of this Bureau's work, it is recommended that candidates have a working knowledge of one of the two official IPU languages, English or French, and are able to travel for activities in the field and at UN Headquarters in New York.

Candidatures from the respective geopolitical groups, which may be submitted up until the time of the elections, should be accompanied by a brief curriculum vitae (maximum one page), specifying Committee membership in parliament and familiarity with the issues covered by the Committee, as well as the candidate's full contact details. The CV should also be accompanied by a commitment from the candidate's parliament that s/he will be supported in their work and included in future delegations to Assemblies.
